

Pillow Finishing Techniques Karen Hammond Moore's of Mission Viejo



Supply List:

- *Your machine in good working order, along with your foot pedal and supply cord
- *Sewing foot, zipper foot for your machine.
- * For the Brotheror Baby Lock machines, the DoubleCording Foot 4-6mm. A must if you want to add piping to your pillow
- The following supplies are based on a 16" pillow your size may be different.
- One 12" embroidery square for a 16" pillow or One 8" embroidery square for a 14" pillow. You • do not have to do a square, a rectangle inset looks great too. May be you want to do 4 little squares to make one big square. So many options.
- *One 18" square piece of fabric for the front, back this piece with a good quality interfacing. I used the Pellon brand Shape-Flex or an interfacing that is close . FUSE BEFORE CLASS!!!!!
- *One 18" x 22" fabric for the back, if your fabric is thin, apply interfacing to this piece too. If it is a denim weight fabric or a pant weight, this is optional.
- *One 16" zipper
- Sharp pencil or ultra-fine marking pen, ruler, sharp scissors, rotary cutter, pins, and any other supplies you use in your sewing room.

- 2 ½ yards cording to go around your pillow. I like to use the cotton clothes- line type. I get mine at Ace Hardware Store. It is very firm, the store has a softer version and is very nice to use. Do not get any larger that a 4-6mm cord.
- 2 ½ yards of 2 ½ " wide fabric strips to make your piping. This can be done with straight grain or on the bias. Stripes look great on the bias. Do not fold in half. The piping is optional.
